CLASS INFORMATION

- Attendance: A positive attitude towards regular punctuality and full attendance at school are most important in ensuring the best possible quality learning opportunities for all students. School begins at 8:55am and concludes at 2:55pm. If your child arrives after 9:10am for school they will need to get a late pass from the office. If you wish to pick up your child earlier than 2.55pm also please see the office to sign them out before collecting them.
- If your child is absent from school then it is a requirement to send a letter the following day explaining your child's absence. If you know that your child will be away from school for more than two days, please contact the school and leave a message for me with our Administration staff. Please notify the school prior to any overseas/extended holiday trips, these will be recorded as an absence.



- Sessions consist of:

Students will participate in;

• small groups instruction at the appropriate level. These groups are fluid and flexible and change according to the students needs. Two- five-weekly monitoring of student progress to identify and plan future instruction.



MATHEMATICS



Daily 45 minute - I hour sessions

Number activities can include:

- Modelled, Guided and Independent learning experience
- small group instruction (usually three to four students)
- short, focused, frequent numeracy sessions (typically 10-minute blocks)
- strategically targeted activities focusing on early arithmetical strategies
- explicit and systematic teaching
- five-weekly monitoring of student progress to identify and plan future instruction.
