



**Colour the activity on the chart when completed.**

<p><b>Syllable Count</b> - write your words and show the syllables in each word. E.g. pic/nic</p>	<p><b>Vowels</b> (a e i o u) - write your spelling words but make the vowels a different colour</p>	<p><b>Wordhunt</b> - make a find-a-word puzzle. Write each letter in a square (words can go vertically, horizontally and diagonally).</p>	<p><b>Sound Groups</b> - write a list of words that sound the same as some of your spelling words</p>
<p><b>Word Building</b> - for example, stop, stopped, stopping</p>	<p><b>Word Pictures</b> - find adjectives to make a word picture e.g. Toler</p>	<p><b>Poems</b> - use your words to create an interesting poem.</p>	<p><b>Jumbled Words</b> - use the letters from one of your words to create other words</p>
<p><b>Alphabetical Order</b> - try 10 words</p>	<p><b>Rhyming Words</b> - Write a list of more rhyming words for words from the phonics list. How many can you write?</p>	<p><b>Spellamadoodle</b> - use your words to draw a picture</p>	<p><b>Map Words</b> for according to where they originated. Create word derivation charts</p>
<p><b>Synonyms</b> - find a basic word to write synonyms and display for our writing (use the thesaurus)</p>	<p><b>Plurals</b> - Change your words into plurals if you can.</p>	<p><b>Words in a Code</b> - create a code, then write your words in the code. e.g. a = 1 b = 2</p>	<p><b>Words in Words</b> - how many hidden words can you find in your list?</p>
<p><b>Snap/memory cards</b> - use a texta to write two lists of your words to cut into cards (play snap or memory at home)</p>	<p><b>Word Snakes</b> - use verbs, nouns, adjectives, adverbs</p>	<p><b>Compound Words</b> - create or identify compound words from your list.</p>	<p><b>Spelling Poster</b> - use your words to create a colourful poster</p>
<p><b>Dictionary Meanings</b> - find 4 words to find their meanings. If there are many definitions find the one that is mostly used and write the definition in your own words</p>	<p><b>Antonym</b> (this means opposite words) - find words in your spelling list to find their opposites (use a thesaurus for this) e.g. the antonym for fierce is tame</p>	<p><b>Sentences and knowing the meaning of words</b> - use a dictionary - find meanings for words - don't just copy from the dictionary, write your own sentence to show you understand the meaning.</p>	<p><b>Analyse Words</b> - find rules/patterns or create compound words or divide words into morpheme and affix</p>
