Why attendance is important:

Research highlights a clear correlation between student attendance and the achievement of quality academic, socioacademic and health outcomes. This research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.

Impact of poor school attendance:

- Lower scores and poorer academic outcomes (AITSL (2019). Attendance matters. Spotlight. Melbourne: Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership)
- Increased likelihood of dropping out of school earlier (Smerilloet al., 2018; Featherston, 2010; Lamb et al., 2004; Suh & Suh, 2007)
- Decreased likelihood of engaging in vocational education (Hancock, K. J., Gottfried, M. A., & Zubrick, S. R. (2018). Does the reason matter? How student-reported reasons for school absence contribute to differences in achievement outcomes among 14–15 year olds. British Educational Research Journal, 44 (1), 141-174.)


The green cell means there was a school excursion/event.

Patterns of lateness can have a serious impact on your child's education.


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Explaining Every Absence

- Please ensure that all absences are explained.
- You will receive a notification for any of your child's absences that are unexplained – please see the office if you are unsure how to respond.




If students are sick they will need to stay at home.

Parents/carers will need to let the school know.

If they are sick for more than 2 days, you will need to see a doctor and get a medical certificate.

The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) may also request medical certificates if there are multiple, frequent sick days and a Health Care Plan may also be required.





Attendance Checks

The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) checks attendance every 2 weeks and shares this data with the school. From this data, school actions are decided upon.

Actions for class teachers include monitoring attendance patterns and late arrivals, and contacting parents/carers where necessary.

Additionally:

~ If attendance is below 50%, the school also sends notifications on the Sentral portal to parents/carers every 2 weeks to let them know what their child's attendance rate is.

 \sim If attendance is between 50% and 90% parents/carers will receive notifications twice a term.

~ Parents/carers will also receive notifications twice a term if students are late for an average of 2 days a week; and every 2 weeks for an average of more than 2 days.

Other school actions

- Letter 1- this letter is sent out to parents/carers when strategies put in place have not resulted in an improvement in attendance for the student. The letter asks parents to contact the school to discuss alternative actions.
- Letter 2 this letter is sent out to parents/carers at least 2 weeks after Letter 1, if the attendance rate has not improved. If there is still no improvement, a Home School Liaison Program application is made. If the HSLO accepts the case, he/she will contact parents/carers and organise a meeting to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan (AIP).
- EDU Education Destination Unknown is an application made to the HSLO, if a student is not sighted for 10 days. This is a legal requirement and a welfare check will be organised between the HSLO and the Police Youth Liaison Officer (PYLO).
